

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

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

Built around the legend, **Kneehigh's Tregeagle** is the story of a penniless shepherd whose desire for the beautiful Bronwyn eventually destroys him. She will not even look at any man who does not possess a fortune. Tregeagle sells his only possession - his soul - in return for the wealth he therefore needs.

Within a few years he has become a prosperous judge, but too late-Bronwyn is married to another. He takes his frustrated revenge on all those who face him in his court. Ambition vaunts ambition. He steals, he cheats, he lies. All for more power.

He bought a place in consecrated ground near St Breock Church and was buried there after his death. The howling was so bad that the local residents had him evicted. He was set the task of emptying Dozmare Pool with a leaking limpet shell. Dozmare, believed to be bottomless, was thought to be a Lake of the Underworld. If Tregeagle ever stopped this endless task, the Black Hunter would claim him.

Our story takes Tregeagle on further adventures in search of a final resting place - driven on by his ambition and love of Bronwyn, even in death. Evicted from this world, he is chased through the Middle Earth on a downward spiral to Hell.

What is Tregeagle's fate? What is his own personal hell? For some is it getting what you want?

Is this story true? Who knows? It could well have been!

Kneehigh Theatre's next touring production is based on the extraordinary life and times of Jean Gaspard Debureau - celebrated in the

the Street of a Hundred Crimes, where dense crowds move among

The Boulevard poured into the Funambles alongside the literary elite and the nobility of France to celebrate the performances of Baptiste Debureau, the common man who never said a word but spoke for all. poverty, they came to celebrate life. They followed Debureau's life beyond the Theatre, observed his marriages were lit they revelled in a shared escape.
