However, fate would soon move Baptiste Debureau into the limelight where he would answer the needs of a dejected and disillusioned Nation still searching for the true revolution.

Formed in 1980 by Michael Shepherd and originally concentrating on work for children and young adults, Kneehigh has, in recent years, developed a style and original approach to drama which is appreciated by any audience, young or old, which values high-quality, exciting, colourful theatre. The Company believes that theatre should be accessible, both in content and form, to as broad an audience as possible and to achieve this we aim to produce work which is visual, imaginative and, above all, entertaining.
