

James has also appeared in Dead Dog in a Suitcase (and other love sonas). Tristan & Yseult and Brief Encounter for Kneehigh.






Ian Ross Composer, Music Director & Musician

Last year he won an ACA award for his writing for children with the company. Emma Rice Director/Co-Choreographer

Emma Rice is Artistic Director for Shakespeare's Globe and the director of Twelfth Night; The Little Matchgirl and A Midsummer Night's Dream. For the last 20 years she has worked for Kneehigh as an actor, director and Artistic Director - her productions include: The Flying Lovers of Vitebsk; 946: The Amazing Story of Adolphus Tips; The Red Shoes; The Wooden Frock; The Bacchae; Tristan & Yseult; Cymbeline (in association with RSC); A Matter of Life and Death (with National Theatre); Rapunzel (with Battersea Arts Centre); Brief Encounter (with David Pugh and Dafydd Rogers Production): Don John (with the RSC and Bristol Old Vic); Midnight's Pumpkin; The Wild Bride; Wah! Wah! Girls (with Sadler's Wells and Theatre Royal Stratford East for World Stages) and Steptoe and Son. Other work includes: West End production of The Umbrellas of Cherbourg, Oedipussy (Spymonkey); The Empress (RSC) and An Audience with Meow Meow (Berkeley Repertory Theatre). She was made an Honorary Fellow of Falmouth University earlier this year for her outstanding contribution to the dramatic arts.

Sophia Clist Designer

From a background of sculpture Sophia creates installations, sets and objects for performers and audiences to inhabit, manipulate and transform. Much of her work is participatory and interactive, collaborating with artists in dance, theatre, music, film, and with the general public. Simon Baker Sound Designer

Simon is an associate artist at the Old Vic (London), Kneehigh Theatre and part of Emma Rice's creative cabinet currently at Shakespeare's Globe. He is recipient of several awards including an Olivier for A.

Matt trained at East 15 Acting School and with the National Youth Theatre. He was awarded the 2015 Bryan Forbes Bursary under the mentorship of Michael Attenborough CBE.

Matt has directed and created work at venues including the New Diorama Finborough, Ambassadors and Criterion Theatre as well as the National Theatre's Temporary space. He most recently collaborated with Olivier Award nominated writer James Fritz on his production of The Fall.
