# From the Director

### The Wild Bride (or The Handless Maiden)

I first had a stab at this epic story in 2002. Commissioned by Éva Magyar and her company, Bill Mitchell (designer then and now) and I travelled to Hungary to create a show based on the ancient story of *The Handless Maiden*. My memory is that it was rather beautiful: lyrical, full of flowers and poetry, pretty frocks and soft kid leather.

I returned home with a sense of achievement. I was proud of the work and held the show in great affection. I put the show on my 'sorted' shelf and forgot all about it, thinking my work was done.

I was, however, fortunate that I didn't understand Hungarian as it has become clear with time that the show was not so beloved by audiences as it was by me! My Hungarian friends had protected me from the truth and I remained in blissful ignorance for many years. Anyway, there was nothing to learn! The show was done... Sorted.

But then came the knocking. I began thinking of the story again. Dreams circled, fragments of memory came into focus and I had a dawning awareness that I had indeed missed the heart, soul and very point of this extraordinary tale. Older, more bruised, and more myself, I decided to make this piece again. Only now was I beginning to understand what it is to do a deal with the devil and what it is to endure.

So, here it is. No party frocks for my women this time. This time there is dirt and blues and brutality. We drew inspiration from the great depression, from African landmine victims and from Robert Johnson. We used our own experience to explore the depths of the human experience and also the possibilities. And this is where story, theatre and life collide! Nuzzling right alongside the archetypal trials that our heroine endures, there is the real wonder of the people playing her and playing alongside her. As she feels that she can't go on, another is singing like a siren; as she feels betrayed, another dances like a dervish; and as she begins to heal, a band plays with passion and empathy. The very people telling the story teach us that we are in this together, that we can go on, that we are capable of anything, that there is indeed hope. We are heroes all: living, breathing, hurting, fighting, enduring contemporary heroes.

So. This story has come of age. Or perhaps I have. Here's to getting up in the morning, to looking forward and back and to being firmly rooted in the moment. But most of all, here's to slow, quiet, sneaky healing.

Now I know why no one notices a tree as it grows Because their deep roots creep down oh so slow And their clever branches quickly learn To blossom only when your back is turned

She danced in shows choreographed by Tatiana Baganova and Avi Kaiser. Patrycja wrote music for a short animation film, a dance piece called *Face, Soundtrack for the Sculptures* inspired by the work of French sculptor Sabrina Gruss, and co-composed music for VDT's *Test Run* and *Motherland*. She has worked with Kneehigh since 2008. As well as touring the world as a Kneehigh actor. Mike runs the Connections programme with Anna Maria Murphy, "engaging creatively with communities through event and adventure," and is a pioneer of Kneehigh's transformable and transportable venue, the Asylum. Recent shows as an actor include: The Wooden Frock, The Bacchae, The Red Shoes, Tristan and Yseult, Cymbeline, A Matter of Life and Death, Don John, Midnight's Pumpkin, Steptoe and Son, and the motion picture Anna Karenina. As a director: Hansel and Gretel, A Very Old Man with Enormous Wings (puppet version with Little Angel Theatre), and The Kneehigh Rambles (co-directed with Emma Rice). Mike is currently developing a new version of The Beggar's Opera for 2014 with composer and conductor, Charles Hazlewood, and Kneehigh stalwart, Carl Grose.

**Myriddin Wannell** (Costume Designer) is a theatre designer and visual artist based in Cornwall. After graduating with a BA Hons in Theatre Design at Wimbledon School of Art, a new wind blew him to Cornwall to study a second degree in Fine Art at Falmouth University. Mydd has worked alongside Bill Mitchell as associate designer for WILDWORKS since the company's creation in 2005. # **About Kneehigh**

From our home in Cornwall, we have built a reputation for creating vigorous and popular theatre for audiences throughout the UK and beyond. In Cornwall, 1980, a village school teacher began to run theatre workshops in his spare time. In due course a mixture of people became involved: a farmer, the sign writer from Tesco, several students, a thrash guitarist from a local band, an electrician. No actors... nobody who had been trained. The workshops took place in the spirit of cheerful anarchy and casually slipped into performance, and finally the production of shows.

There were no theatres or arts centres in Cornwall; Kneehigh created theatre for families in locations within their communities, village halls, marquees, harbour sides... and less conventional places. They created theatre on cliff-tops, in preaching pits and quarries, amongst gunpowder works and arsenic wastes, up trees, down holes, where the river meets the sea and where woodland footpaths end.

The company now finds itself celebrated as one of Britain's most exciting touring theatre companies. We create vigorous, popular theatre for a broad spectrum of audiences, using a multi-talented group of performers, directors, designers, sculptors, engineers, musicians and writers. We use a wide range of art forms and media as our 'tool kit' to make new and accessible forms of theatre. A spontaneous sense of risk and adventure produces extraordinary dramatic results. Themes are universal and local, epic and domestic.

Cornwall is our physical and spiritual home. We draw inspiration from its landscapes, history, people and culture. Our rehearsal base is a National Trust barn on the cliffs near Mevagissey and our office is in Truro, the administrative centre of Cornwall. We take pride in our Cornish identity, and seek to inspire 'pride of place' in our Cornish audiences. Cornwall has a long and lively history of international trade and cultural exchange. For a county so distant from the capital, it boasts remarkably cosmopolitan and global influences and culture. We are proud to be an active part of this tradition.

# From Kneehigh



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
